Subcommittee Reports

Treasurer's Report – Nannette Henderson

A report was distributed.

Craft/Vendor Fair - Liz Mullany/Denise Krein

Fair is Saturday, December 5, 2015 from 10am-3pm. Mrs. Mullany stated that there are 113 vendors, with 8-10 more coming this week. In mid-November the Art Department will be painting the signs to advertise and we will need help putting them out into the community a week before the event. Mrs. Mullany would also like volunteers to attend other craft fairs to put out fliers about our fair on the cars in the parking lots. She also needs help with the Cookies with Santa in the gym during the event. The entertainment in the cafeteria will be from the guitar and orchestra groups. She is also working with Anne Quigley to coordinate food and snacks in the Concession stand. A Sign-up Genius will be going out soon with all the needs for the Craft Fair.

White House Ornaments - Karen Walsh/Michele Randall

Mrs. Randall reported that 200 of the 300 ornaments have been sold, and the Committee will be at the Craft Fair to sell off remaining stock.

Magnets - Liz McGregor

Mrs. Lane reported \$1,140 in magnet sales. They are working on a new vendor for the magnets. The committee will be restocking, and getting a supply for the rising 6th graders (Class of 2022) from elementary schools to sell at upcoming events.

Lawn Signs - Charlene Lane

Mrs. Lane reported that 40 sign for \$600 have been sold.

Graduation Raffle - Laura Gedra

\$100 in raffle tickets have been sold; if you haven't bought yours, please do.

Flocking - Catherine Benavides

Mrs. Benavides reported that they have a total of \$1,040 in income. Fourteen of the 38 are future dates through May. Of the 14, nine have paid. Kudos to Carolyn Kerat who is assisting me with this fundraiser. We are continuing to advertise Flock-A-Friend at school events and social media. Recommended PTSO to include on their Twitter as a

direct tweet, retweet, or liked tweet. Kudos to Dave Gedra. He gave me steel rods that can be used as replacement legs. We are currently missing six sets and some are bent. This is a cost avoidance of \$50 to buy new legs.

Decorations – Pamela Kipps

Mrs. Kipps was waiting on the theme to move forward with ideas. During a discussion the group came to the decision that the focus of the decorations should be centered in the registration area, with the theme being prominent throughout the event, such as road signs, room designations and the like. Mrs. Kipps will coordinate with Liz Mullany to visit the decorations that are stored in South County to see what we can use.

Donations (Letter Writing) – Ronni Jillions

Mrs. Jillions sent a report stating “We have gotten to date \$1,550 in donations and a 4 ticket voucher for the Potomac National’s baseball team.”

Prizes – Joan DeLaurentis/Christine Hulse

Mrs. DeLaurentis reported that they are resting before Black Friday. If you have any suggestions from your senior for what to go out and buy, please forward them onto her for inclusion in their overall list going into their buying frenzy. They will be spending 1/3 of their budget during this weekend.

Activities – Alisa Romero

Ms. Romero is still checking on other companies, other than Fantasy World which has been with us for a few years. In November new items from Fantasy World are coming out, and we should have prices from them at that time. We are working on cost-effective games and activities (i.e., corn hole, etc.). The idea of a hypnotist for the Auditorium when the students gather before prizes are handed out was discussed. Mrs. Williams will check with Mr. Ragone on being able to accommodate that for the students.

Ticket Sales – Barbara Cammarata/Laura Gedra/Betsy Gates

Mrs. Cammarata reported that thus far she has sold 55 tickets. Tickets will be sold during all lunches Nov. 16-20 to increase ticket sales and collect signed contracts. She is looking for volunteers to help sell tickets during lunch hours to drum up business. The incentive is that if students buy their tickets before December 1st, they will be included in a drawing for a \$100 gift card from Amazon. If you buy before January 30th you will receive 20 extra raffle tickets for the event. Discussions were had around how to advertise (e.g., stickers when they buy at lunch, getting a picture with “Medal Man, Class of 2016 twitter page, etc.).

Food – Marcia Ross

Mrs. Ross has the theme and will be coordinating with Mrs. Mullany on getting some of the decorations for table decorations. Having extra water, freezer pops and ice cream available was talked about as the rooms tend to be overly hot during the event.
